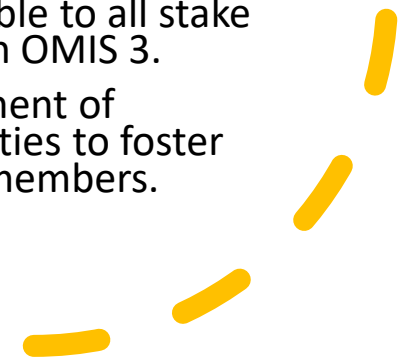

Changes in operations since last Legislative Session:

- Administrative Rules updated and published July 8, 2022
- Developed and implemented a Policy and Procedure Manual effective November of 2022.
- Web-site updated and reviewed on monthly basis.
- Inmate orientation manual updated and placed on institution tablets and public website.
- Migration of Board data February 2022 creation of dashboard for data quality oversight and statistical information from last five years.
- New phone system installed in Deer Lodge office to better serve the public.
- Access to LEXIS legal research.
- Parole reports are now uploaded and available to all stake holders in the Department of Corrections on OMIS 3.
- Improved information sharing with Department of Corrections in OMIS 3 and with staff in facilities to foster better informed decision making by Board members.

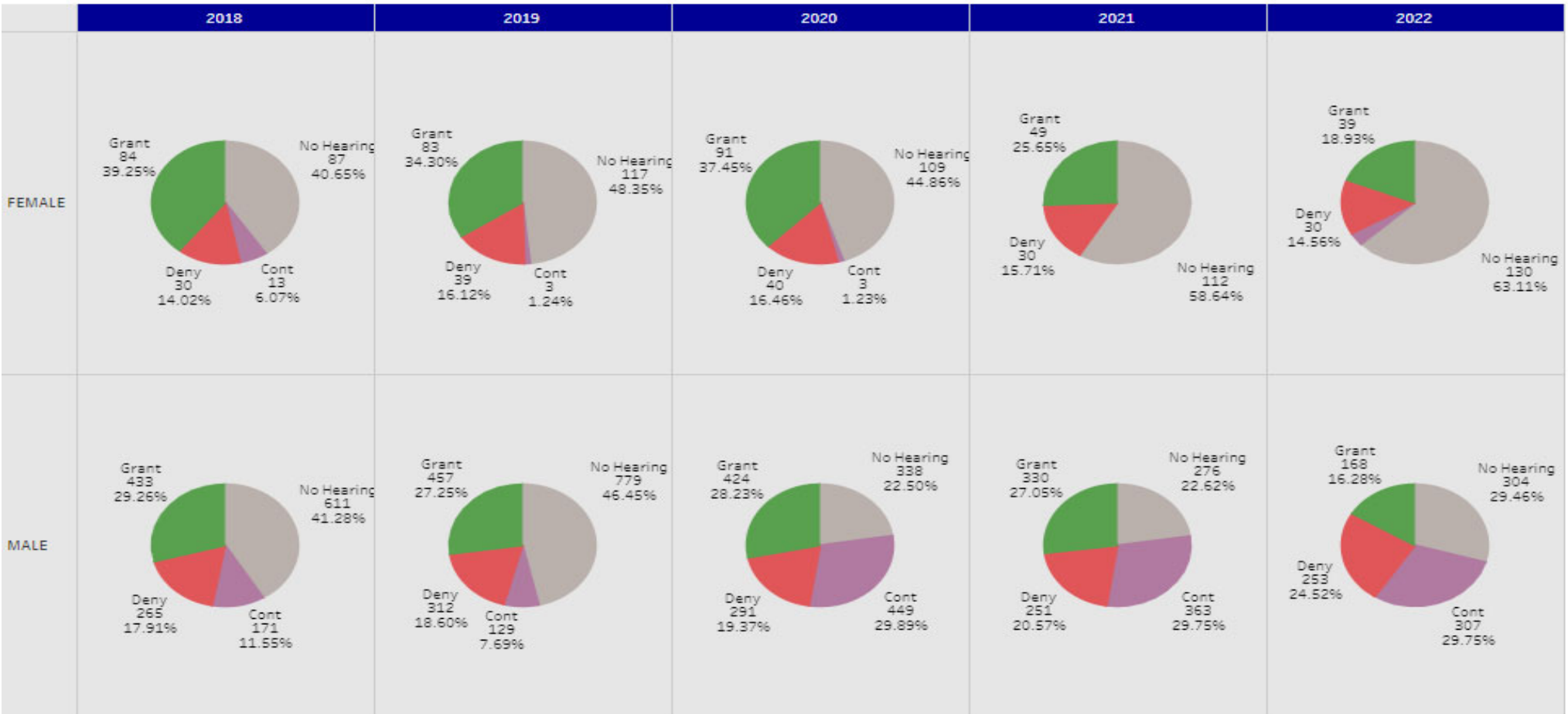

Better Practices being utilized since last legislative session:

Enhanced Transitional Supervision Services (ETSS) program being utilized as condition of parole on the first 180 days of supervision.

Status reports to the Board are being requested on high-risk offenders that have been paroled to determine the offenders' progress.


Board Identifies young male offenders for placement at Pine Hills for treatment programming and vocational training to obtain a trade as a condition of parole.

The Board has worked with Case Managers and Institutional Parole Officers to ensure the parole report includes pertinent information to make better informed decisions.

Record checks are now being conducted on Conditional Discharge from Supervision cases (CDFS) on an annual basis.

Board no longer automatically reinstates parole on an offender that has revoked after 120 days of clear conduct.

Scheduled work in progress:

- Requested Counsel of State Government (CSG) to review Guideline Scoring (GLS) on sexual and violent offenders.
 - Obtaining accreditation through American Correctional Association (ACA).
 - Working with Interstate Compact Unit to develop a consistent uniform report of violation (ROV) to address all interstate compact violators in the hearing process.
 - Working with Criminal Justice Institute (CJI) on implementation efforts in addressing revocation trends.
 - Working with administrative services office of the Governor in updating application and procedures of Executive Clemency.
 - Working with the Department of Corrections to release a dashboard for public access.
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Resources and Expansion of Services Requested:

- Additional Victim/Witness Coordinator position.
 - Increase placement of inmates granted parole to prerelease centers.
 - Expansion of Enhanced Transitional Supervision Services (ETSS) program.
 - Work with Criminal Justice Institute (CJI) and Department of Corrections to identify and implement re-entry programs.
 - Accountability component for all sober living homes to include licensing and certification oversight.
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
