These Departments provided funds for the “Reentry Initiative”. Related agencies in Montana are involved at the local level.

The Youth Services Division of Montana obtained a three-year grant in 2003 to expand services to youth. After the grant period was completed in 2006 the Department of Corrections Youth Services Division obtained Montana State General Funds through the Montana State Legislature to continue providing the same level of services.

The Division developed **Juvenile Reentry Aftercare Coordinators**, “**Guide Homes**” (foster homes for hard to place youth), community **Mentors** and enhanced **Faith Based** and health related services.

**Services** are provided to youth returning to the community from a secure correctional facility placement.

Two **Juvenile Reentry Aftercare Coordinators** work with the facility staff, community staff and community reentry team members to assure the smoothest transition possible.

**Family Integration and Commitment Meetings:** Specified family members will visit the Correctional Facility to acquaint themselves with the treatment programs provided.

There is funding available to assist family members with these travel expenses.

**Reintegration Community Support Teams:** Local teams to work with Juvenile Parole Officers to support youth successfully returning to the community.

## Great Falls Youth Transition Center

The **Transition Center** provides housing for up to 7 male youth on parole supervision. The program focuses on education, treatment, employment, community service and restitution, life skills, and appropriate recreation. Youth are assessed and staffed upon arrival, and a case plan is drawn up to address the needs of each youth. Case plans are reviewed at three month intervals. All youth are required to have a constructive day and participate in activities that fit within their individual schedules.

The Center focuses on youth who are having a difficult time adjusting in the community after being released from a secure facility. The Transition Centers provide separate housing for males and females. The program allows a graduated sanction option other than sending a youth back to a correctional facility. It is also used for youth who are leaving a secure facility when another appropriate placement is not available, or when the youth needs a short-term placement while awaiting another community.

The program uses a behavioral point system wherein youth earn privileges to participate in weekly community recreation outings. They also earn privileges to participate in more extensive incentive outings. Youth can learn to have fun in ways that do not hurt themselves or others and improve physical fitness. The outings also provide reinforcement for pro-social behavior.

Mentors and tutors enhance the program by improving youths' school performance and offering a positive adult influence outside the Department. They also offer group sessions using the cognitive approach. Menu development and food preparation skills are stressed in addition to other life skills training.

Today Youth Homes provides an array of services to youth and families, in home and out of home, according to their needs. Services include shelter care in Missoula, Hamilton and Kalispell, therapeutic group care for adolescents, therapeutic family care as foster care or as support delivered in families' homes and a wilderness program.

Youth Homes and the Department of Corrections are contracted for Guide Home Services which are specialized foster care or in-home family support service for paroled youth.

Though referrals to our services most often come from Western Montana, we are willing to consider service for clients from other regions and communities within Montana as long as the service meets the needs.

Youth Dynamics (YDI) is a private, non-profit agency providing mental and behavioral health services to Montana youth and families. YDI operates residential services in many Montana communities through our more than 90 treatment foster families located throughout the state and our nine group homes located in four Montana communities. Their Clinical Offices offer treatment in 17 locations across the state and services generally can be provided in any community within 60 miles of a YDI office.

Their campus at AYA Boulder serves youth with a wide range of SED diagnoses and offers outdoor adventure activities, volunteerism, and a certified climbing tower. AYA Boulder also offers services specifically for youth who have highly sexualized behaviors, including reactive youth and those with a mild-moderate risk to offend.

## **MT Youth Homes**

Montana Youth Homes (MYH) is a program of Rocky Mountain Development Council, Inc. Montana Youth Homes has two facilities, the Jan Shaw Youth Home for girls and the Margaret Stuart Youth Homes for boys. The homes serve clients ages 12-18 that are referred through Department of Family Services and Youth Court, youth that are runaways, homeless or those that have nowhere else to go. Residential services are provided to clients in need of emergency, short-term shelter or long-term group home placements. Montana Youth Homes also provides services through the Holdover Program and the Runaway and Homeless Youth Program, Youth on Track to Adulthood (Independent Living Training) and Supported Independent Living Services.

The MYH Holdover Program works in collaboration with local law enforcement officials to provide youth with a safe, secure place to be supervised as a diversion to incarceration. This program allows youth who have committed a status offense to stay at one of our homes for up to 8 hours while a suitable adult is found to take custody. (available for Lewis and Clark county only)

The Runaway and Homeless Youth Program allows our facility to be open to any youth in need of care who is a runaway, homeless or imminently homeless. Youth in this program can stay at MYH for up to three days while a youth case manager works with the client on finding or developing a support network, accessing necessary services and finding a safe place for the youth to live.

The Youth on Track to Adulthood Program (YOTA) consists of the MYH daily curriculum and a 12-week independent living training program for all youth. There are nightly mini courses and weekly groups that include field trips and professional speakers. This course is designed to teach the youth the skills they will need once they age out of the youth care system. The twelve topics taught are employment skills, personal record keeping, housing, goal setting, banking and investing, law and justice, nutrition and menu planning, effective communication, healthy recreation, car and home repairs, the importance of education and basic health and the body.

The Supported Independent Living Services (SILS) is possible through an agreement between Montana Youth Homes and the Department of Health and Human Services. The SILS program can provide DPHHS youth with aftercare case management and support past their 18th birthday while they live in the Helena community. Montana Youth Homes completes a variety of tasks with the youth to ensure the youth's safety while they live independently. Through the SILS

program youth can receive assistance finding safe, affordable housing, accessing resources to meet their physical; emotional; social; educational and employment needs and receive weekly contact and assistance from MYH staff and mentors.

Title I of the Workforce Investment Act of 1998, establishes a One-Stop Delivery System for workforce investment activities. The one-stop delivery system is a system where entities responsible for administering separate workforce investment, educational and other human resource programs and funding streams (referred to as one-stop partners) collaborate to create a seamless system of service delivery designed to enhance access to the programs services and improve long term employment outcomes for individuals receiving assistance.

WIA requires partnerships in the one-stop delivery system. Those partners include: Title 1B adult, youth, and dislocated worker programs; Job Corps; Native American programs; Migrant Seasonal Farm worker programs; Veterans' workforce programs; Wagner-Peyser Act programs; Adult Education and Literacy Activities; programs authorized under Title I parts A&B of the Rehabilitation Act; Welfare-to-Work programs; Senior Community Service Employment activities; Carl Perkins postsecondary vocational education programs; TAA and NAFTA assistance programs; HUD; UI; employment and training programs authorized under Community Service Block Grant programs; and veterans' employment and disabled veterans outreach programs.

A licensed mental health center and placement agency committed to the preservation and restoration of natural families. Our approach is a strength-based family centered model designed to follow our families and their needs.

They provide a number of services that can work independently or collaboratively to build a system of support for the family in need. These services include; Family therapy in home or in an office setting, Community Based Psychiatric Rehabilitation and Support (CBPR&S), Case management, Comprehensive school and community treatment (CSCT[Missoula only]), Therapeutic Family Care (moderate), PRTF Waiver services, Early childhood services and short-term foster placement. These services work together to provide community wraparound support.

They do not have a program. They collaborate with a family to decide what they want and are able to do. Any combination of services can occur to individualize the care necessary to maintain community and home placement. The hours they are able to provide are from 4 hours per week to 30 hours of direct service per week for a client (special circumstances allow us to do much more if needed, but it is a longer startup period). Usually a team consisting of a clinician, coordinator, and at least one support specialist work together to provide direct care. Case management acts as an advocate and facilitator for the family to ensure that direct care needs are met as well as working with the family to assist in the process of building their own natural support system.

Referrals must have an SED diagnosis to be eligible for services. Services are covered by Medicaid. They also accept private insurance and have a sliding fee schedule.

## **Ted Lechner Youth Services Center**

Yellowstone County's Ted Lechner Youth Services Center is a multi-service campus located in Billings. The Center provides specialized adolescent programs targeted at delinquent and at-risk youth. The Youth Services Center has a twenty-year history of providing services to youth in shelter care and secure detention as well as outpatient and community based services to the adolescent population.

### **Shelter Care**

The Acute Crisis Care (shelter care) facility provides placement for 15 youth aged 12 – 17. Males and females are accepted for placement. ACC provides a temporary placement for youth to stabilize, receive crisis intervention or treatment, and to transition to independent living. Typically, most youth reside in the shelter for less than 45 days, however, youth who are in treatment or transitioning to independent living may stay longer.

### **Youth and Family Stabilization Program**

This is a short-term, intensive intervention program for youth and families. The program uses a shelter care stay as an opportunity to intervene with the youth and family. Intensive and individualized programming focuses on rapidly preparing the youth and family to continue treatment on an outpatient basis. At least 90 days of aftercare follows the shelter care stay. The program has been successful at treating youth from across the state, using various long distance therapy options for after care.

### **Intensive Outpatient Chemical Dependency Program**

YSC Treatment Alternatives is an intensive chemical dependency program that specializes in treating adolescents who typically do not respond in traditional treatment models. Focusing on the role of addiction in everyday life, family dynamics, and criminal thinking, this group brings a pragmatic and reality based perspective to treatment. Youth may attend on an outpatient basis or reside in shelter care while in treatment.

### **Evaluation Programs and Treatment Services**

The Youth Services Center provides a range of evaluation services to youth residing in the Center and through outpatient services. Licensed and experienced professionals working and partnering with the center specialize in adolescents. A residential stay is required for those services that are marked with an (\*).
